Update - Province of Zambales, Philippines
Provincial Coastwatch Environmental Monitoring System User Fee

The International Chamber of Shipping (ICS) has issued the attached circular on the latest developments concerning the collection by the Province of Zambales of the Provincial Coastwatch Environmental Monitoring System User Fee.

The ICS's circular advises of the first written official notification that invoices raised against ships that transited the coastal waters of Zambales should not be paid. The circular further says that there is no need to make payments on invoices raised by Zambales for coastal surveillance, though a final confirmation is still awaited and expected to be received in the near future.


Gentlemen:

In connection with the subject, we have used good offices and personal coordination with the Provincial Board of Zambales since October 2015. On November 16, 2015, I attended the session of the Provincial Board of Zambales. The letter of the Department of Interior and Local Government (DILG) including the letter of Filipino Shipowners Association (FSA), which we represent, both recommending suspension of the implementation of the Provincial Ordinance No. 28, s. 2015 entitled ORDINANCE FOR THE PROVINCIAL COAST WATCH SURVEILLANCE AND ENVIRONMENT MONITORING SYSTEM IN THE PROVINCE OF ZAMBALES was being deliberated on in the Committee on Environment and as well as in the Committee on Laws chaired by Board Member Renato Collado.

In the afternoon, after the session was concluded, I spoke with Board Member Collado in the presence of several board members and I was advised that we can inform the members of FSA and other similarly situated shipping entities that they can suspend payment of the fees and charges imposed under the said ordinance pending review of the said Provincial Ordinance.
